1. How will request assist in achieving Department Goal and benefit the customer?

In this request, the department seeks funding contributions from the city and county to transition our COVID public information officer to a regular department position ongoing. In FY 22, we anticipate keeping our 1.0 COVID PIO until mid-year and request city and county assistance with transitioning that full-time position through the rest of the FY, therefore the FY 22 request is 0.5. The benefit of a dedicated public information office for the department has been demonstrated during the COVID-19 Emergency Response. With this position we have fielded thousands of public inquiries, complaints; announced rapidly established testing and immunization opportunities, made timely connections to other services, improved the quality and timeliness of our public messages and solicited, handled, and analyzed public comment. The department's strategic plan (ending FY21) had identified marketing services to the public and better engaging all members of the community for program and policy-making participation, input, and improved mutual awareness of public health needs and resources. Methods and resources identified to meet this goal were more in the marketing arena, but our experience with a dedicated PIO during COVID indicates this essential function is best served by integrated, internal staff dedicated to these functions department-wide. This will allow us to coordinate better with, rather than rely upon, the generous support of city and county communications personnel, and initiate public information in a more proactive fashion. Our accreditation standards require various PIO functions and a designated PIO, but until COVID, the department had been fulfilling this function in a fragmented fashion. Although this past strategic plan year (of our 3-year plan cycle) could not address this priority goal during COVID, board, staff, media, and community partner comments are projecting that the new strategic plan will again adopt this priority goal for the FY 22-25 department strategic plan. Total cost for FY 22 is \$38,438. At a 60:40 proportion for city and county respectively, the request to the city is \$23,060.

2. What specifically is needed to achieve this goal?

In latter FY22 city and county tax contributions are needed to transition the current COVID Public Information Officer (PIO) into a health department PIO. This will be at a professional staff, non-management level. Transition funding is needed for half of a year (January-June) or a 0.5 FTE in FY22. Upon assessment of this transition, the department will likely request funding for a full 1.0 FTE in the following year, FY23.
