Summary Description and rationale of project and funding sources:							
<p>The Honeysuckle trail was built in phases between 2006 and 2011, by 2013, all trail segments had been fully paved. This trail is a designated safe route to school (Meadow Hills Middle School). The condition of the paved trail has deteriorated to the point it appears the best, most cost effective approach would be to remove and repave. The trail is in poor to very poor condition based on extent of shrinkage cracking, longitudinal cracking, alligator cracking, spalling, and ravelling, all indicate the useful life of the asphalt trail is nearing its end. The poor condition is not likely suitable for a simple overlay and as such, full reconstruction is recommended in order to adequately and safely serve trail users.</p>							
History & Current Status: Impact if Cancelled or Delayed							
<p>Honeysuckle Trail is just under 1 mile long. The paved trail runs through Wapikiya Park and Honeysuckle Park such that it links and connects adjoining neighborhoods to Meadow Hill Middle School. The trail is a designated safe route to school. Snow and ice removal are provided throughout the winter months, however, the deteriorated trail condition makes this work more difficult and adds time. If there is a delay in funding, based on current trail degradation, it is possible the asphalt trail will deteriorate to the point it becomes out of compliance with ADA, and could become much more difficult to clear of snow and ice.</p>
