1. How will request assist in achieving Department Goal and benefit the customer

The City of Missoula has set incredibly important and ambitious goals to mitigate climate change. Not only do we have city operations goals around clean electricity but we also have community-wide goals as well. With the passage of federal legislation in 2022 we are facing an unprecedented moment of funding availability to help us achieve our goals to electrify buildings, transportation, new developments, and more. However, the City's transportation and climate action teams are not currently staffed with adequate capacity to successfully seek those new funding sources and administer the programs and funds should we receive awards. This position will complement existing staff in the climate action team as well as the transportation planning team to lend capacity to lead communitywide electrification work through grant writing, program development, measurement of outcomes, and coordination of electrification strategy across teams. All CPDI and PWM Specialists currently participate in some grant writing activities as new opportunities arise, and this additional capacity will enable us to streamline the application process and manage funds and develop programs on the back end.

Primary focus areas will include: Transportation Electrification - Advance the Long Range Transportation Plan priorities around vehicle and fleet electrification including EV charging, community outreach and policy setting. And Building Electrification - Advance the City's Electrify Missoula campaign, in partnership with Climate Smart Missoula and Missoula County, to support residents and businesses in transitioning to full building electrification with highly-efficient technology.

2. What specifically is needed to achieve this goal?

One additional CPDI Specialist (CL) FTE to be shared between the Transportation Planning team and the CPDI Community Development team.
