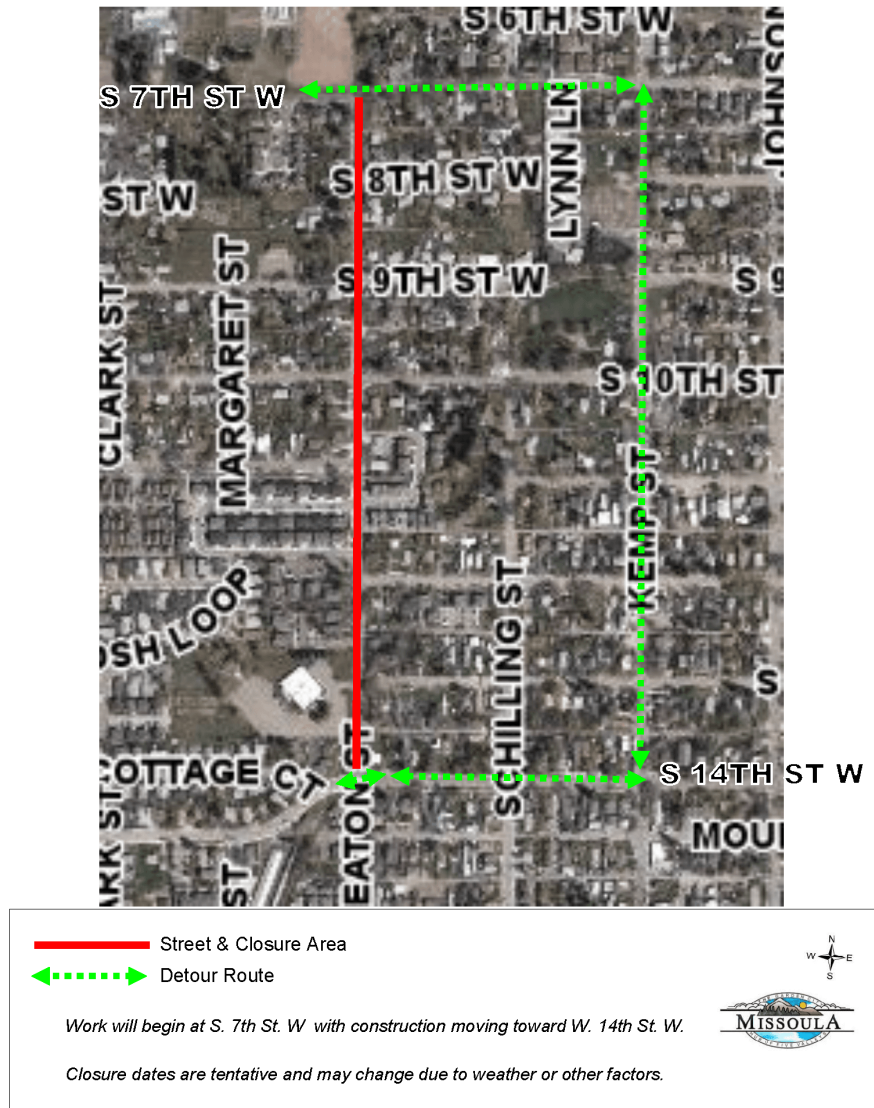


2024 Street Maintenance Projects

Milling & Paving

Eaton St. — S. 7th St. W. to S. 14th St. W. — Mill & Pave Project

Location: On

Eaton St. from S. 7th St. W. to S. 14th St. W.

Description: Intermittent milling off of deteriorated pavement followed by application of new asphalt.

Benefits: Completing intermittent pavement repair projects such as this helps preserve the street infrastructure by fixing damaged areas that allow water to seep into and under the pavement. Water damages the street below the surface, especially in the winter when the water goes through freeze and thaw phases, causing the asphalt to break up and results in potholes and other damage to the street. Making these repairs now will extend the pavement's life significantly and delays more expensive total reconstruction work in the future.

Project Dates: Work is planned to begin on Wednesday, May 15, 2024, with pavement installation completed the week of May 20. Work hours are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Additional Information: Work will begin at 7th St. and move south to 14th St. Watch for posted detour signs, and drive slowly and cautiously though the detour route. We suggest planning an alternate route, if possible.

Local access to homes will be allowed, but on-street parking will **not** be allowed. Watch for abrupt edges if entering the construction area.

Lincoln Hills Drive — North of Contour Road to Rattlesnake Drive

Location: Lincoln Hills Dr. between just north of Contour Rd. to Rattlesnake Dr.

Description: Intermittent milling out of old, degraded asphalt and replacing with new asphalt.

Benefits: Completing intermittent pavement repair projects such as this helps preserve the street infrastructure by fixing damaged areas that allow water to seep into and under the pavement. Water damages the street below the surface, especially in the winter when the water goes through freeze and thaw phases, causing the asphalt to break up and results in potholes and other damage to the street. Making these repairs now will extend

the pavement's life significantly and delays more expensive total reconstruction work in the future.

Project Dates: Begins April 23 with completion expected by April 26, 2024. **UPDATE:** Due to an issue with our equipment, work is expected to last until about May 3, 2024.

Other Information: Work will take place between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekdays. Local access will be available for homes along the route. Watch for flaggers to detour traffic around the work area. We ask drivers and bicyclists to please be extra cautious around the construction area. We suggest choosing a different route when possible.

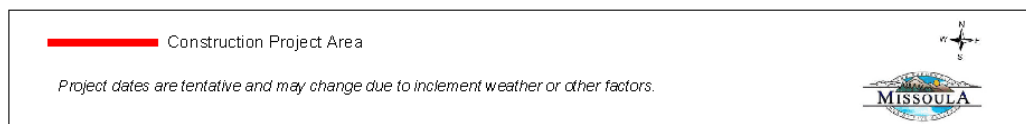

Other Information: The Streets Division asks that residents along Mount Avenue do not park their vehicles on the street during the work hours of 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekdays. Local access will be available for homes and businesses along the route. There will be intermittent detours around the work area, so we ask drivers and bicyclists to please use caution and watch for detour signs. We suggest choosing a different route when possible.
